# 2025-2030 Strategic Plan

The Dog and Cat Management Board's (Board) five year strategic plan sets out their strategic directions and priority actions. The strategic plan supports the Board to execute its functions under the *Dog and Cat Management Act 1995*.

### 2025/26 Business Plan

The annual business plan and budget describes the Board's proposed operation plan and associated budgets for the financial year, that deliver on the Dog and Cat Management Board's five year strategic plan.

In addition to fulfilling statutory obligations, the Board are focused on the delivery of significant projects to the state, relating to effective dog and cat management during the 2025/26 financial year:

- 1. Implementation of new Breeder licencing regulatory operations
- 2. Transition from DACO 1.0 to DACO 2.0
- 3. Supporting implementation of a statewide cat management strategy

# Fulfill objects of the Act Encourage

Encourage responsible dog and cat ownership

Success looks like:

- Increased dog and cat owner compliance, particularly in relation to microchipping, desexing and registering.
- Implementation of a new, cost-recovery, breeder regulatory framework.

- Implementation to a new Dogs and Cats Online system.
- Increased number of cats recorded on Dogs and Cats Online.
- Continued facilitation of appropriate community educational programs.

#### Reduce

Reduce public and environmental nuisance caused by dogs and cats.

Success looks like:

- Decreased number of dog attacks.
- Reduced number of unwanted dogs and cats.
- Greater consistency for cat management across council areas.
- Support statewide cat management strategies and actions.

#### **Promote**

Promote the effective management of dogs and cats.

Success looks like:

- Improving relationships with stakeholders.
- Increasing collaboration on dog and cat matters at a national level.
- Being financial sustainable.
- Applying evidence based dog and cat management principles.
- Reviewing the Dog and Cat Management Act and Regulations and making recommendations to the Minister.

# Partnership & collaboration

Engaging and investing in relationships to promote responsible dog and cat management.

#### Evidence based decision-making

Focussed on informed strategies to reduce:

- dog attacks
- nulsance cats
- · unchecked breeding
- · euthanasia rates

### Simpler regulation

Consult with stakeholders to ensure future reviews of the Act, regulations, Board policies and frameworks have less red tape.

Foster a culture that promotes effective governance and industry leadership.

### Dog and Cat Management Board Budget 2025/26

The Board's budget is funded by the Dog and Cat Management Fund (fund). A percentage of dog registration fees collected by councils, as set the *Dog and Cat Management Regulations 2017*, and breeder registration fees are payable to the fund.

The fund is managed by the South Australian Treasury, and the Board may expend money from the fund in accordance with a budget approved by the Minister.

The Board anticipates the running costs of the new Dogs and Cats Online System to reduce following implementation in 2025/26. The Board also anticipates ongoing costs for implementing and running the new breeder licencing requirements, in support of the government election commitment of banning puppy factories. Staffing and operational costs are based on a cost recovery model from 2026/2027.

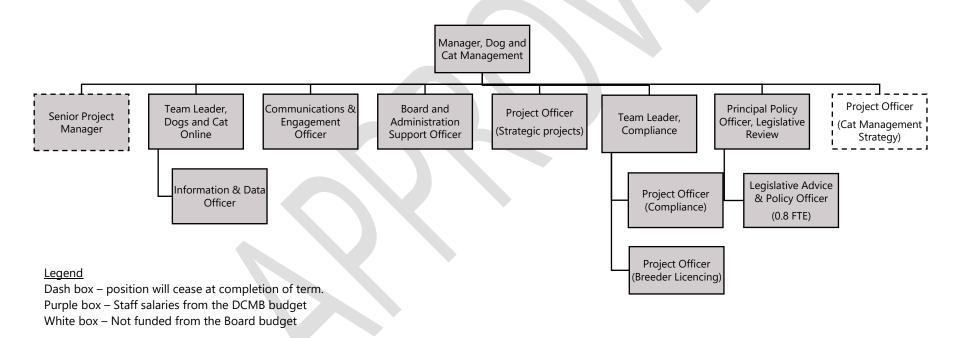
